A sentence is said to be a complex sentence if it contains single independent clause and at least one dependent clause along with it. It may contain more than one dependent clauses. A dependent clause is a group of words written together that does not contain a subject and may not give a complete thought to the reader.

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Grammar rule #1: A complete sentence must include a noun and a verb. A noun is a person, place, thing or idea. A verb is an action word. Example 1: The bird flew. In this sentence, the noun is "bird" and the verb is "flew". Grammar rule #2: A complete sentence must include a subject and a predicate. The subject refers to the person, place or thing which the sentence is about.

Typically, sentences contain a subject, verb, and object. There are many ways to construct a sentence, so review all of these building blocks to use them correctly. (An independent clause contains a subject and verb and expresses a complete thought.) I like coffee. Mary likes tea. The earth goes round the sun. Mary did not go to the party. Compound Sentence Structure. A compound sentence is two (or more) independent clauses joined by a conjunction or semi-colon. Each of these clauses could form a ...

Sentence structure is the way a sentence is arranged, grammatically. The sentence structure of your writing includes where the noun and verb fall within an individual sentence. Sentence structure depends on the language in which you're writing or speaking. It's common in English for a simple sentence to look like this: "She throws the ball."

A simple sentence is a sentence with just one independent clause (also called a main clause): Judy laughed. A compound sentence contains at least two independent clauses: Judy laughed and Jimmy cried. A complex sentence contains an independent clause and at least one dependent clause: Jimmy cried when Judy laughed.
